
There are a number of ways to approach painting your banners:

Bring if you have: Various broad edge and pointed pens Ruling pen, cola pen, folded pen Automatic pens (½", ¾", 1") Favorite pointed brushes (for use with watercolor, ink & gouache) Favorite flat brushes (for wash and broad strokes) Cheap house painting brushes (1", 1-1/2" or 2") Any big brushes Other unusual writing tools you already have **OTHER MATERIALS** Bring if you have: 3" or 4" soft rubber brayer Palette Paper Pad Pencils/graphite stick (you need pencils for thumbnails) Color brush markers/black felt tip pens/calligraphy pens Spray paint/graffiti markers Stencils Cutting mat X-acto with #11 blades Cheap Chinese pointed brushes Old toothbrush and spritzer bottle

Glue brushes (White Chinese Bristle Brushes—1-1/2" and 2")

Glues (I use Sobo, Yes Paste, Matte Medium and Elmer's Art Paste)
